WHAT IS IT?

The American Gaited Mule Association is a group of people who have gotten together for the following reasons:

- To have a good time.
- To promote gaited mules.
- Sponsor classes or shows.
- Form a registry of gaited—mules, jacks, jennets, and mares.
- Train and supply judges.
- Interact with other horse and mule organizations.
- Educate the public on the virtues of the gaited mule.

The not-for-profit organization was founded in 1994 by nine people interested in the goals above. These people are from Tennessee, West Virginia, Texas, and Kentucky. Some have mules, jacks, horses or a little of all. You do not have to have an animal to join the Association.

WHAT IS A GAITED MULE?

A gaited mule is any mule that has a smooth gait other than a walk, and one that is distinct from a trot. Some gaits are listed in the box below.

Mule Gaits

1. Single-foot
2. Fox-trot
3. Rack
4. Running Walk
5. Stepping Pace
6. Paso Fino
7. Other

Whatever the gait may be called, its primary virtue is smoothness. The gaited mule can be ridden farther without discomfort from the bouncing one experiences at a trot, and at a more manageable pace than a canter. A gaited mule is great for trail-riding.

Many gaited mules are born from Tennessee Walking Horse, Saddlebred, or Racking mares, but some are out of Quarter Horses. For this reason, there is no requirement that the parents of a gaited mule be gaited.
